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What are the Opportunities?

- Training and education to prepare students to serve as correctional facility staff.
- Opportunity to serve an industry that rehabilitates and assists with public safety.
- Associate of Applied Science degree.
- Program driven by the Kansas Department of Corrections; curriculum developed by advisory board members representing the corrections industry.
- Program suitable for current correctional employees as well as individuals interested in joining the corrections industry team.
- Program credits available with Kansas Department of Corrections Basic 200 hour training.
- Individuals must be at least 18 years of age or older to become a corrections officer, but students can start the coursework before that age.
- Completion of the program can lead to promotion within the corrections system.

- Classes delivered via ITV at Ellsworth Correctional and Larned Mental Health Correctional Facilities.
- Dedicated advisement assists students in achieving their learning goals.

Occupational Outlook:

- Employment growth is expected to be faster than the average for all occupations, and job opportunities are expected to be excellent.
- Median annual earnings of correctional officers and jailers were \$35,760 in May 2006. The middle 50 percent earned between \$28,320 and \$46,500.
- Median annual earnings in the public sector were \$47,750 in the Federal government, \$36,140 in State government, and \$34,820 in local government.
