B. LEGISLATIVE DEPT.

MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

The "population represented" by each of the members of congress and of the State legislature is estimated from the vote polled at the State election on the 5th of November, 1878. The basis of estimation is upon the ratio of 5 1-2 people to each vote cast for Governor. Although this may be very nearly correct in the eastern and older-settled counties, yet it is undoubtedly too high for the newer counties of the State. For there are many single men, hav-claims and no families, who can vote, and other voters whose families have not yet arrived. On the other hand, however, there are many people constantly coming in who cannot vote; so that, on the whole, the figures may even shortly be too low.
